Saturday 15th February 2020 MBKA Annual General Meeting

Time: 2 – 5pm

23 members braved Storm Denis to attend the AGM. The Chairman welcomed everyone and thanked them for venturing out on such a wet day. The Minutes of the 2019 meeting were agreed as correct and accepted unanimously.

The Annual report produced some interesting updates particularly with regard to the New Apiary Site (Mark Ballard had laid out a number of photographs for us to browse over) and the New Member's Area Website.

Mark informed us that the new site was currently very muddy due to ground disturbance by the farmers very large tractors. However, once the weather improves, we are looking for a number of members to help with renovation work on the Pavilion and grounds. Mark also appealed for help with inspecting the colonies at the City Way Apiary. He explained that you don't have to have years of experience, as you will always work alongside other more experienced beekeepers. The more we have the less of a burden this essential task will be on those who do volunteer. The Apiary have a number of experienced people who will attend inspections each week and we are looking for others to help support and provide cover as we cannot inspect bees on our own for safety reasons. Paul Lawrence outlined the reasons for having a secure Member's Area and explained how some members are experiencing difficulties logging into the site. Members will need to log into the new site to take advantage of up to date information.

Sonia Belsey reported that the swarm phone went well this year. Peter Kimber asked if there was support for those who perhaps did not have the confidence to go out on their own. It was suggested that if a member wished to learn how to collect swarms then they could be

'buddied up' with a more experienced person. Mark also suggested that this could be the topic of an Apiary Meeting later in the year. Sonia again asked for volunteers to collect and house swarms and to let her know if anyone was interested

The Annual Report was accepted unanimously.

We then moved to the Treasurers Report. John Hendrie commented that our accounts and balances are in good shape. However, the New Apiary is going to incur higher costs than at present. We continue to make healthy profits on The English Festival and the Annual Supper. The extra courses that we now offer, which include Associate Membership are also a good source of income. After thanking John for his sterling work, the Report was accepted unanimously.

The Membership Subscriptions for 2021 are to remain at £30 for a full member, £10 for an Associate and £1 for a Junior. This was unanimously accepted.

Pip Blaxland is retiring from the role as our President and the Chairman warmly thanked him for his unstinting support over many years not only to the Association but towards himself personally. Both Pip and Daphne were presented with some fine whisky. Pip then gave a charming little speech as he thanked everyone for the mutual support he had benefitted from since he started to keep bees in 1947 at the age of just 18 years old. The Association members have always been helpful and friendly and for him that was the very essence of good beekeeping. Thank you Pip you are a most charming and gracious man and we all wish you well.

We then moved onto the election of officers and committee members:

John Hendrie accepted the nomination to be President and John Chapman accepted the

Chairman's role for another year. John Hendrie then accepted the positions of Treasurer and

Membership Secretary, with the understanding that this would be his last year in these roles.

Sheila Stunell accepted the role of Secretary. All were elected unanimously.

The committee members remain the same. Mark Ballard Apiary Manager, Elaine Laight Apiary Co-ordinator, Bob Smith Education Officer, Paul Lawrence Newsletter and Website Manager, Sonia Belsey Swarm Phone Co-ordinator Tony Edwards Mentoring Co-ordinator. All were again elected unanimously.

Jen Ferry agreed to take on the role of Meetings Secretary but she will not be a member of the committee.

The Chairman then summed up and thanked John Hendrie and Sheila Stunell for their continued hard work. He also thanked the rest of the committee for their efforts over the past year. He then appealed for help with running our stall at events such as The English Festival which is our next big outside commitment. Tony then appealed for anyone who could be a 'Bee Buddy' to a new beekeeper. It is vital that we help and support our new beekeepers in their first crucial year. He asked that anyone who is able to help to please contact him.

The next AGM will be on Saturday 20th February 2021. The meeting closed at 3.50pm.

Swarm Phone 2020:

Swarms may be a distant thought at the moment especially with the weather we've been having but it won't be long until swarm season is upon us and with that comes the swarm phone!

For those of you that might not know we run a voluntary swarm collection service between April and September and for it to be as successful as previous years I'm after volunteers. There are a couple of roles which need covering:

Swarm Phone Holders: each week a different volunteer will 'man' the phone, dealing with reports of swarms and passing the details on to swarm collectors local to the swarm. You're not expected to go out to all the swarms the week you have the phone just co-ordinate the swarm collectors. You will also have to arrange the passing on of the phone to the next swarm phone holder usually on a Sunday. If you have any preference for weeks you wish to cover, then let me know, and I certainly won't stop you volunteering for more than one!

Swarm Collectors: these are people who are willing to go and collect swarms in their local area, again you're not expected to be available 24/7. If you can only do weekends or are going on holiday just make a note in your email along with what areas you can collect swarms in. You're also not expected to keep all the swarms you collect for those we need...

Swarm Adopters: we need a list of beekeepers willing to adopt the swarms into their apiaries. There's no guarantee we can supply you with one but if you are in need / want a swarm let me know. We ask that you be flexible and understand that swarm collectors may not be able to keep them for extended periods of time for you to collect

Also, we're aware that some people may want a little more experience in collecting swarms. Some may have chased a few around their apiaries, but going out to others can be daunting! If anyone has some experience but would like to build their confidence, let me know and I can add your details to the rota and ask if any swarm collectors go out near you that they try and contact you so you can join in! We are also hoping to run a swarm session at the apiary in the coming weeks. Look forward to hearing from you!

Apimondia 2019:

You will probably all be aware that an unacceptably large percentage of the honey exhibits submitted to the 2019 Apimondia Honey Show were disqualified for a range of reasons including adulteration, fraudulent labelling and residue analysis.

Apimondia have just published their position on this area, recognising that fraudulent practices undermine the whole of the honey market and the trust that consumers place in the product. We should recognise that these practices go on, but emphasise the value of local production, traceability and integrity in justifying the price we ask for a jar of proper, local honey.
